To require the Secretary of Energy to establish a program to increase participation in community solar and the receipt of associated benefits, and for other purposes.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Community Solar Con-

- 7 (a) Definitions.—In this section:
- 8 (1) COMMUNITY SOLAR.—The term "commu-
- 9 nity solar" means a solar power plant, through

2	shared by 2 or more electricity customers.
3	(2) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means
4	the Secretary of Energy.
5	(3) Subscriber.—The term "subscriber"
6	means an electricity customer who receives direc

8	output of the community solar facility of the cus
9	tomer.
10	(b) Establishment of Community Solar Con
11	SUMER CHOICE PROGRAM.—
12	(1) In general.—Not later than 1 year after

17	that do not have regular access to onsite solar

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under paragraph (1) with existing Federal programs

(3) Assistance to state and local govern-
MENTS.—In carrying out the program under para-
graph (1), the Secretary shall—
(A) provide technical assistance to States
and local and tribal governments for projects to
increase community solar;
(B) assist States and local and tribal gov-
ernments in the development of new and inno-
vative financial and business models that lever-
age competition in the marketplace in order to
serve community solar subscribers; and
(C) use National Laboratories (as defined
in section 2 of the Energy Policy Act of 2005
(42 U.S.C. 15801)) to collect and disseminate
data that assists private entities in the financ-
ing of, subscription to, and operation of com-
munity solar projects.
(e) Federal Government Participation in Com-
MUNITY SOLAR.—The Federal Government is encouraged
to participate in community solar projects, including by
subscribing to community solar facilities.
