## 3 SEC. \_\_\_\_. FOREST SERVICE LEGACY ROADS AND TRAILS 4 REMEDIATION PROGRAM.

Public Law 88–657 (16 U.S.C. 532 et seq.) (commonly known as the "Forest Roads and Trails Act") is
amended by adding at the end the following:

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# "SEC. 8. FOREST SERVICE LEGACY ROADS AND TRAILS RE MEDIATION PROGRAM.

3 "(a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 180 days after the date of enactment of this section, the Secretary, acting 4 5 through the Chief of the Forest Service, shall establish, and develop a national strategy to carry out, a program, 6 7 to be known as the 'Forest Service Legacy Roads and 8 Trails Remediation Program', within the National Forest 9 System (as defined in section 11(a) of the Forest and Rangeland Renewable Resources Planning Act of 1974 10 (16 U.S.C. 1609(a)))— 11

12 "(1) to carry out critical maintenance and ur13 gent repairs and improvements on National Forest
14 System roads, trails, and bridges;

15 "(2) to restore fish and other aquatic organism
16 passages by removing or replacing unnatural bar17 riers to the passage of fish and other aquatic organisms;

19 "(3) to decommission unneeded roads and20 trails; and

21 "(4) to carry out activities associated with the
22 activities described in paragraphs (1) through (3).

23 "(b) PRIORITY.—In implementing the program under
24 this section, the Secretary shall give priority to any project
25 that protects or restores—

26 "(1) water quality;

"(2) a watershed that feeds a public drinking
 water system; or

3 "(3) habitat for threatened, endangered, or sen4 sitive fish or wildlife species.

5 "(c) NATIONAL FOREST SYSTEM.—Except as author6 ized under section 323 of the Department of the Interior
7 and Related Agencies Appropriations Act, 1999 (16)
8 U.S.C. 1011a), each project carried out under this section
9 shall be on a National Forest System road or trail.

#### 10 "SEC. 9. ROAD SYSTEM ANALYSIS.

11 "(a) DEFINITION OF DECOMMISSION.—In this sec12 tion, the term 'decommission' means, with respect to a
13 road—

"(1) to restore, through active or passive
means, natural drainage, watershed function, or
other ecological conditions and processes that are
disrupted or adversely impacted by the road; and

18 "(2) to remove the road from the transportation19 system.

20 "(b) Identification of Minimum Road System.—

21 "(1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 3 years
22 after the date of enactment of this section, the Sec23 retary shall identify for each unit of the National
24 Forest System (as defined in section 11(a) of the
25 Forest and Rangeland Renewable Resources Plan-

1	ning Act of 1974 (16 U.S.C. $1609(a)$ )) the minimum
2	road system necessary for—
3	"(A) safe and efficient travel within the
4	National Forest System; and
5	"(B) the administration, use, and protec-
6	tion of the National Forest System.
7	"(2) REQUIREMENTS.—Each minimum road
8	system identified under paragraph (1) for a unit of
9	the National Forest System shall—
10	"(A) meet the resource and other manage-
11	ment objectives adopted in the land and re-
12	source management plan applicable to the unit;
13	"(B) meet all applicable statutory and reg-
14	ulatory requirements;
15	"(C) be in accordance with long-term fund-
16	ing expectations; and
17	"(D) minimize any adverse environmental
18	impacts associated with the construction, recon-
19	struction, decommissioning, and maintenance of
20	the minimum road system.
21	"(c) CONTENTS.—In identifying minimum road sys-
22	tems under subsection $(b)(1)$ , the Secretary shall—
23	"(1) incorporate a science-based roads analysis
24	at the appropriate scale;

1	"(2) incorporate a long-term fiscal analysis that
2	includes an assessment of maintenance costs;
3	"(3) identify as unneeded any roads that—
4	"(A) are no longer necessary to meet forest
5	resource management objectives; and
6	"(B) may be decommissioned or considered
7	for trails; and
8	"(4) consult with—
9	"(A) appropriate State, Tribal, and local
10	governmental entities; and
11	"(B) members of the public.
12	"(d) UNNEEDED ROADS.—
13	"(1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall decom-
14	mission any roads identified as unneeded under sub-
15	section $(c)(3)$ as soon as practicable after making
16	the identification under that subsection.
17	"(2) Priority.—In decommissioning unneeded
18	roads under paragraph (1), the Secretary shall
19	prioritize the decommissioning of roads that pose the
20	greatest risk—
21	"(A) to public safety; or
22	"(B) of environmental degradation.
23	"(e) Records.—The Secretary shall regularly up-
24	date the Infra database of the Secretary to record—

"(1) each road identified as unneeded under
 subsection (c)(3); and

3 "(2) each road decommissioned under sub4 section (d)(1).

5 "(f) REVISION.—The Secretary shall review, and may
6 revise, an identification made under subsection (b)(1) for
7 a unit of the National Forest System during a revision
8 of the land and resource management plan applicable to
9 the unit.".
